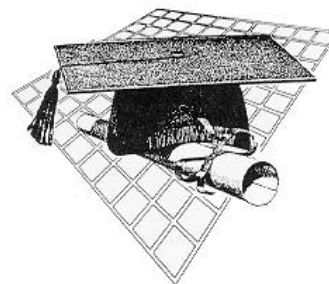
Graduate Student Research Award

Dr. A. E. Ted Wall is a retired Professor in the Department of Physical Education, McGill University. He is a former Chairperson of the departments of Physical Education at the University of Alberta and, his alma mater, McGill University. He also served as the Dean of the Faculty of Education, McGill University

Dr. Wall's research on children who are physically awkward and have an intellectual disability from a knowledge-based perspective has been funded by the Max Bell Foundation, IBM Canada and Fitness Canada, as well as the Alberta Recreation, Parks and Wildlife Foundation.



Dr. Wall is an avid sailor and enjoys canoeing and hiking. In the winter, he cross-country skis and walks on Mount Royal.

The recipient of this award will be sponsored to present her or his research findings at the Annual General Meeting of the Active Living Alliance for Canadians with a Disability.

This year, the AGM will be held concurrent to the International Symposium on Active Leisure for Citizens with disabilities October 12 to 15, 2005 in Edmonton, Alberta. The award includes economy travel costs (air or rail) to and from the Symposium, a waiver of conference registration fee, and accommodations.

- Applicants must be available to attend the National Forum on Physical Activity and Disability (date and location to be determined each year)

2. Research projects that relate to disability and sport, recreation and leisure, physical education, or physically active lifestyles of Canadians with Disabilities.

Not Eligible

1. Research projects that have been published or previously presented at a conference or symposium.
2. Research projects that are already eligible for travel funds through other research funding sources.
3. Previous holders of this award.

This year, the AGM will be held concurrent to the International Symposium on Active Leisure for Citizens with disabilities October 12 to 15, 2005 in Edmonton, Alberta. The award includes economy travel costs (air or rail) to and from the Symposium, a waiver of conference registration fee, and accommodations.

Eligible Applicants

Canadian students who are currently enrolled in a graduate level program at a Canadian or a non-Canadian university are eligible to apply. The applicant must be the principal author of the submitted scholarly paper.

Eligible Research Projects

1. Research projects that exemplify the vision, mission, and goals of the Alliance.
2. Research projects that relate to disability and sport, recreation and leisure, physical education, or physically active lifestyles of Canadians with disabilities.

Not Eligible

1. Research projects that have been published or previously presented at a conference or symposium.
2. Research projects that are already eligible for travel funds through other research funding sources.
3. Previous holders of this award.

How Applications Will Be Judged

An advisory panel named by the Alliance is responsible for judging the applications. The successful applicant will be informed by September 12, 2005. Applications will be assessed on:

1. Compliance with the eligibility criteria
2. Application completeness
3. Availability to present at the Forum
4. Strength of the research project.
